



Henry L. Adams Memorial Scholarship

Henry Lyle Adams (Yellow Eagle) was a Native American rights activist who was instrumental in negotiating peaceful resolutions of volatile situations between Native Americans and state and federal government officials. A successful strategist, tactician, and negotiator, Adams worked for tribal sovereignty using protests and court challenges to protect Native American rights on traditional territories. He also produced the documentary film *As Long as the Rivers Run*.

Recipients will receive one full scholarship for a *Grantsmanship Training Program - Online* course and textbook (value \$1,255). Recipients will have 6 months from the date of the award to register and complete the class on the dates of their choice. Applicants must be working with a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization and submit:

- This application
- Documentation of 501(c)(3) status (Determination Letter from the IRS or current 990)
- Organizational budget showing revenue of \$1,000,000 or less. Budget includes revenue & expenses.

Deadline to apply for the 2024-2025 cycle is Friday, November 1, 2024.
